

Conflict minerals

Dear customer,

We are seeing a marked increase in the number of enquiries we get about the use of “conflict minerals”. The term “conflict minerals” refers here to the extraction of four minerals – tin, tungsten, tantalum and gold – in the Democratic Republic of Congo and nearby countries. The production of these minerals is used to finance, directly or indirectly, armed groups in the area, who use violence against the local people as a means of warfare.

Colly Components only buys goods from respected and reliable producers. All our supply partners have regular contact with their suppliers, as set out in the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform, Consumer Protection Act 2010, Section 1502, which prohibits the use of conflict minerals in the production of steel and steel products that they supply. As far as we know today, no conflict minerals are used in our products. We are continuing to work with our suppliers to ensure that no conflict minerals from the Congo or nearby areas will be present in our products.
